ABOUT

LifeCycles is a charitable society working to cultivate community health by connecting people with the food they eat and the land it comes from. We support the region in growing, accessing and eating local food in ways that foster biodiversity and enhance our urban environment.

LifeCycles is seeking summer staff to support in the development and delivery of school garden camps. Coordinators will work collaboratively with other staff to run children and youth gardening day camps over the months of July and August at different school garden sites. The job includes promoting, planning, preparing, and running weekly camp programming for elementary and middle school-aged young people that engages campers in the exciting world of school gardening and outdoor education.

Depending upon funding, we may also be hiring a Youth Leadership Coordinator to support in the development and delivery of summer garden youth programming. The position will include working collaboratively with other staff to support youth engagement and leadership by promoting, delivering, and evaluating two specific programs: 1) Garden Youth Apprenticeship Program and 2) Urban Learning Garden's Youth Program. The candidate will be responsible for amplifying diverse youth voices in our local food systems through hands-on outdoor educational programs.

We are seeking candidates who enjoys working on multiple activities and goals, are well-organized, enjoy working with children and youth, and are passionate about food security.

- Develop, deliver and promote garden-based camp programming for children and youth
- Garden maintenance and care, including watering, planting, harvesting, and weeding

- Track program information with quantitative and qualitative indicators
- Prepare a final report on project activities
- Support with other LifeCycles' community events as needed
